
# **Children in Need Christmas Shopping Spree**

Parents see the fruit of their lives in their children, who become living witnesses to the great hope in our Lord Jesus Christ. Each of us, whatever our state in life, are "in the world for a purpose — to receive God's love ourselves and to show God's love to others. God seeks to heal a broken universe. He asks us to be his witnesses and helpers in that work."

#### Meditation

#### From Pope Benedict XVI's Spe Salvi.

Whoever is moved by love begins to perceive what "life" really is. He begins to perceive the meaning of the word of hope that we encountered in the Baptismal Rite: from faith I await "eternal life" — the true life which, whole and unthreatened, in all its fullness, is simply life. Jesus, who said that he had come so that we might have life and have it in its fullness, in abundance, has also explained to us what "life" means: "this is eternal life, that they know you the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent" (Jn 17:3). Life in its true sense is not something we have exclusively in or from ourselves: it is a relationship. And life in its totality is a relationship with him who is the source of life. If we are in relation with him who does not die, who is Life itself and Love itself, then we are in life. Then we "live."

2. In what ways has the faith and God's love shown me how to love?

3. Why is having a relationship with God so important to really "living"?

### ATTENTION BOWLERS....

The Springfield Diocesan qualifying round of the Knights of Columbus Illinois State Council Bowling Tournament will be held Sunday, February 6<sup>th</sup>, 2022 start time is 2:00 pm at Bowl Haven Lanes in Alton. Please see below for further information. If you are interested in entering the tournament either as an individual or as a team, please contact Lynn Ripper by email at <u>lynn.ripper@att.net</u> or by phone at (618) 799-9255. The entry deadline is February 3<sup>rd</sup>.

- 4 person team event with at least 2 Knights of Columbus members on each team, 2 non-Knight guests (male or female) will be allowed. Handicap will be 80% of 220
- Cost will be \$25/person (\$100/team) of which \$10 will be for local prize money and state awards. Bowlers wishing to participate in single competition will pay an additional \$10 fee, again for local prize money and state awards, with the top 3 single competitors advancing to the state finals. Singles competition will use individual scores from the team event.
- Teams and individuals finishing in the top 3 positions will qualify for the Illinois State Council Championship at Landmark Lanes in Peoria on Saturday March 5th with all entry fees paid from the local tournament prize money. The next team or individual down in the standings will replace any of the qualifying teams or individuals unable to make the championship tournament.
- Highest league average from prior year will be used unless current average for at least 21 games is 10 pins or more higher. Bowlers having no previous average will use 170 for men and 150 for women.


